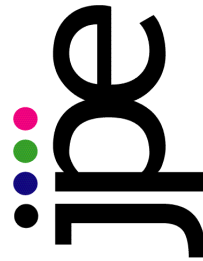
Social Activities

Application is made by completing the form enclosed. This application is then presented to the JPE Committee for approval.

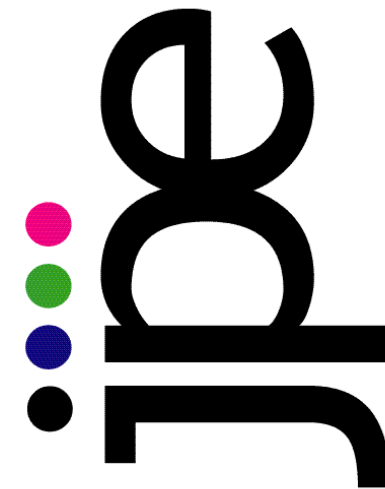
